The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m.

1. **Approval of Minutes** – The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as distributed.
2. **Student Leadership Symposium** – There are two leadership meetings. The Leaders Dinner in February, and the Leadership Symposium that is scheduled for March 1 at 6:00 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom. This discussion is related to the Leadership Symposium in March. There will be a reception, meal with speakers, and then workshops. The first one was held last year. - d) **SHAC In-Service** – Lots of ideas came up last week and a nontraditional student panel came to the forefront. Kim Barker provided the article on nontraditional students from the ODE and Dennis Munroe provided resource information. Office of student life has someone who works with nontraditional students in general.

Consensus today was to go forward with the nontraditional student panel as the SHAC in-service presentation. The next step would be to contact groups that nontraditional students are associated with. Leslie Straight and Folake Soetan will contact the nontraditional student union to find out if they will be able to help in getting students to be part of this presentation and participate in our panel. It was suggested that we include contraception and family planning services, and dental issues for nontraditional students as this seems to come up with this group often. The
