The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m.

1. **Approval of Minutes** – The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as distributed.
2. **ACHA Conference Attendance** – At last weeks meeting it was decided that the SHAC bylaws should be amended to state that a student attending conferences sponsored by the Health Center has to be either an appointed member or an appointed alternate. Urva Kuzma and Kelly Teeter will discuss this with Tom Ryan.

Leslie Straight would like to pull out of the running for attending the ACHA conference this spring, but would like to be in the try for attendance at the PCCHA conference next Fall.

This narrowed the choices Urva Kuzma and Noelle Ronco. Both spoke to why they wished to attend the ACHA conference, what they hoped to learn, and bring back to the SHAC. Urva will not returning next year, but feels she could make the information beneficial to everyone here and would be happy to share the knowledge gained. Noelle felt she not have much experience with SHAC, but going to ACHA would help her grown and contribute a lot more to this group. She will returning to SHAC next year. After the brief speeches were given ballots were distributed for voting and tallied by Kelly Teeter. Urva Kuzma was chosen to attend the ACHA meeting.

3. **SHAC Recruitment** – Spring term is when SHAC recruitment is done, usually the last three weeks of April. SHAC recruitment is held every spring term. The assignment for SHAC students is to bring a friend who might be interested to the meetings. Recruit for members for our team.

Recruitment Ads are run the last 3 weeks in April and are staggered to different days to try to get the information to a wider audience. The first week the full ad is run on Tuesday and Thursday. The second week the full ad is run on Monday and Friday. The third week the full ad is run again on Tuesday, but a shorter ad stating that “Applications are due tomorrow” is run on Thursday.

Other ways that SHAC members recruit members to this group are:

- Taking overheads to classes, asking permission of the professor beforehand,
- Posting flyers around campus.
- Changing the bulletin board to advertise our recruitment.

4. **Peer Health Education Recruitment** – Ramah announced that Peer health applications are being accepted, for next fall. The only criteria is that the student must be at least a sophomore. Application is available on the main health education web page. Application can be filled out and submitted on line.
5. **Leadership Symposium Debriefing** – Michael Laws, Urva Kuzma, Norma Khedi, Kelly Teeter, and Angela We all received invitations to attended the Leadership Symposium this year.

Angela Wu attended the Conflict Resolution workshop, which she found to be a great experience where she learned some interesting points;

There are always positive aspects to conflicts.

No leader can do everything, Thus, we should assume that “everyone has a piece of the puzzle” and foster collaboration.

If you jump to the problem really fast, you might be solving the wrong issue.

Kelly Teeter had issues with the workshop presentation as she felt like it more of a lecture format and not a workshop. Activity was directed towards people acting out the skit and the outer circle was in theory going to be allowed to make comments on what they viewed from the activity. This was not the case and she felt that a workshop means everyone participates. However she did receive some good information.

Folake Soetan participated in the Ethical Decision Making workshop. She also thought there was going to be more active participation, but felt there were pretty interesting ethical decision making exercises.

Urva Kuzma and Michael Laws participated in the How to Lead with a Vision workshop and got a lot of good information. They worked on how to figure out what the immediate problem is that needs to be addressed and then worked on how to work through it, communicate about the problem with others, establish what the emergency is, and then communicate on how to work on it and take action. Urva thought the handout was good because provides model of systematic approach to identifying something that needs change, putting it through the process, and actually putting it into effect.

The Leadership Symposium this year was different than last year, which was more active participation. This year’s workshops were in pretty much a lecture type format. There was information to take away, but the format was not as interactive. There was an opportunity to give feedback. Perhaps the difference this year was that the workshops were led by university administrators and last year they had both students and administrative people doing the leading.

4. Updates:

- a. **In-service Date & Further Information Received** – Tuesday, May 16 at 8:00 a.m. is the date when the SHAC in-service for the Health Center employees. Folake will check with the nontraditional student union director and coordinator on what response was to the email we asked them to send. The question was raised as to whether we can serve food for the in-service as this is early in the morning and would most likely increase participation.
- b. **Health Center Web Site** – Annie Dochnahl will be presenting to SHAC the information she received from the journalism students regarding the Health Center web site through a survey. Paula Staight and Ramah Leith would like the SHAC members to check the Health home page for professionalism and ease of use (<http://healthcenter.uoregon.edu/>) For comparison you can go to www.colorado.edu/healthcenter/resources and scroll down to “college health professionals” and click on “college health centers.”
- c. **Health Information Survey** – Please bring the surveys that have been filled out by your peers and classmates back so we can get the data compiled.
- d. **1% for Art Committee** – Dan Bentley reported that the slide review of the artwork proposals submitted is scheduled on March 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The submissions were through the Oregon Arts Commission. The committee members will review the proposals and Dan will bring information on what was submitted back to the SHAC next turn. He will check to see if additional attendees are allowed. We will put this topic on agenda for first meeting of spring term.
- e. **Student Insurance** - Next week Debbie Alley, Student Insurance Coordinator, and perhaps Brian Corcoran, Insurance Consultant will be on the agenda to discuss what they found in their research regarding low cost insurance plans.
