The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m.

1. **Approval of Minutes** – The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as distributed.
2. **In-Service Preparation:**
 - a. **Introduction of Guests** – Potential panel members, nontraditional students (Erica Roberts and Kyna Langhorn and campus resources (Karen Logvin and Jon Wei), also guest students (Dennis Foo and Maria Greene) were introduced.
 - b. **Outline for Meeting** – The in-service outline and potential questionnaire to be sent out onto the nontraditional students were distributed today for discussion. Kyna Langhorn suggested we only have questions number 3 and 4 on the questionnaire for nontraditional students to make it shorter and more likely that nontraditional students will submit answers. The Health Center staff is the audience for this in-service. We are hoping to have a handout with names and titles of the people on the panels, questions, and can be used as a feedback form.
 - c. **Facilitator** – A facilitator is needed for the in-service, someone who is dynamic and will introduce the panel members, give the definition of a nontraditional student, and keep the conversation moving along. Noelle Ronco has volunteered via e-mail to be the facilitator. Kelly and Urva would do this, but as Noelle has volunteered they conceded to Noelle.
 - d. **Format** – Folake Soetan and Leslie Straight went through the format for the meeting, outline and actual room set up. This will be an opportunity for sharing both the needs of nontraditional students, how the Health Center can meet those needs, and what other source of resources are available to meet those needs. This is information gathering for us to see what changes could possibly be made in future years. We can not say we will be adding services right away. Changes in services/programs and additions in staffing are usually brought to SHAC for their consideration. At this point this is information gathering for things that we can actually accommodate within what is currently available, a sharing of the fact that the student population is diverse, and also to share resources on campus and in the community for both the Health Center staff and nontraditional students.

Question Topics for the Nontraditional Students:

- What are the problems you see with the UHC?
- What services do you use most often?
- What were the attitudes of Health Center staff towards you? Did you feel respected?
- What health issues do you have?

3. **Items Not on the Agenda** – There was just an announcement today that a health care worker was diagnosed with the mumps yesterday in Eugene. In most years that would not be of major concern, however, there have been 1500 cases in the midwest with over 1,000 in Iowa from December 2005 to present. Therefore, whenever a case is seen, we will be on the alert—watching and waiting to see what transpires. Students are encouraged to check their immunity either naturally or by vaccination, by either having had the mumps or had

2 shots of the vaccine. If we do find that more cases are occurring there will be more recommendations coming out.

4. **Adjournment** – The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 p.m.
