1. **Updates on Upcoming Projects:**

a) **International Coffee Hour** – *

Suggestions:

It would be a good idea to put together an outline of what speakers should present; what information the Health Center staff is looking for.

Also from their standpoint, what are their resources that we are unaware of, how would you like to interact with the Health Center, what information would you like us to have? What is your system of communication. What services do you offer and how could students benefit by the Health Center staff knowing about them?

We also need to survey the Health Center staff to see what information they are interested in hearing about. Ashley will send an e-mail to Kim Barker to send to Health Center staff asking what information they are interested in learning from these groups.

Invite speakers to a SHAC meeting a few weeks before to give them a chance to get to know us and us them.

3. **National College Health Association Survey Question** – Paula Staight presented the National College Health Assessment to SHAC. Prior to this assessment being available the Health Center had put together a telephone survey that was done by Oregon Survey Research Laboratories (OSRL) that has provided 10 years of comprehensive data. OSRL no longer exists but the National College Health Assessment came about just in time to take it's place. It was organized by the American College Health Association and we can compare our data with other like campus/schools data. The data can be broken down by demographics.

There is the ability to add up to 5 additional questions to the survey and Paula is looking for additional questions at this time. Requests have been made referring to a smoke free campus and one health center manager has requested a question regarding student dental health. A mass e-mail will be sent out to students in preparation for contacting them to do the survey. There will also be advertising this in the Emerald to let students know this will be coming. The suggestion was made that a notice be placed on the top web page for the university that this is coming.

The survey is done a month after Spring Break. This is the first time as an electronic survey that is web based.

This survey has been submitted to the University Internal Review Board for their approval. Paula is working with the Registrar's Office for 3600 random e-mail addresses for student contact. Students who actually participate in the survey will be eligible for one of twenty-five \$20 gift certificates.

This is an evolving focus to make sure the issues being focused on are actually relevant to campuses. There are always limitations on who will be responding to the invitation to do the survey and this will be a randomized sample of 3600 students. The sample is randomized by using all students with a program the Registrar's Office.

4. **Items Not on the Agenda:**

- a) Denis Munroe introduced Natalie, the Ombudswomen for the ASUO senate. The Recreation Center is exploring with the ASUO Senate a new model for funding and is interested in the way SHAC works in terms of budget, with administrators and SHAC. Natalie has asked SHAC members to stay after the meeting to give her their input regarding their role as SHAC members.

5. **Adjournment** – The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 p.m.
