2. **Debrief – ISA Coffee Hour**

Comments/Suggestions:

The power point program could have been more upbeat. Add a SHAC recruitment slide. This power point program could be used for other tabling events.

This is a real social event making it hard to start a conversation about the Health Center. We need to work on efficiently communicating why we were at the coffee hour and how we can help the students who are there.

Is the coffee hour the best venue for this and a time when international students actually pay attention to us? We have been doing this for several years and still are not getting their attention so this event is not as effective as we would like it to be. Is there another venue where there would be more attention to what we are trying to say? Are there any club meetings where SHAC could do a brief presentation. Becky Megerssa stated that she will check around to see if there are either some other events or tabling opportunities at events. Student groups coordinate the events and she could help put SHAC in touch with the directors and co-directors of the different groups.

Perhaps we go directly to the people who run the Mills International Center on how we can get our information to the international students.

We also need to look at the multicultural center as well. They have good events which would also help to diversify these groups as well. IAffairs sends out weekly emails to all international students about upcoming events, openings, workshops, anything pertaining to international students. Perhaps this would be a good place to advertise for peer health interns and SHAC members also.

Handouts are needed for events such as the list of winter happenings regarding the Health Center that appeared in the Oregon Daily Emerald.

The Counseling Center has an unofficial student group like SHAC and they would be interested in swapping meeting attendance and collaborating on tabling and other events.

Perhaps we could have a raffle with chances for prizes given to those who answer questions regarding the Health Center correctly.

Kim could make "SHAC" cookies using our t-shirt logo.

10. **Outreach:**

Health Faire Tabling – Julie Charron is interested in working with the Health Faire as a good resource to use in getting good information out. Julie will talk to her friends and gather information for a rough draft of general ideas and get contacts and/or dates to book the EMU.

7. Inservice Brainstorming

- a) The SHAC in-service for the Health Center is scheduled for Tuesday, May 13. The length of time is usually about 40 minutes with the need for staff to return to their departments to prepare for the clinic to open at 9:00 a.m. Will there be pre in-service refreshments. 5. Updates:

- a) **Student Building Fee Allocation** – Mike Eyster stated that the Student Building Fee Allocation committee has a meeting scheduled for Thursday, February 7, 7:00 – 8:30 a.m. Proposals have been submitted by the EMU, Recreation Center, Health Center, and Career Center so it will be a hard group to compete for funds with. Kate Davis is the Health Center representative and asked other students to join her at the meetings.
- b) **Clean Air Project** – This group has been renamed, “Clean Air Project.” Julie Charron stated that Nicki Hewlett, Peer Health Educator, has taken over the Peer Health Clean Air project. Julie brought buttons and key holders that are used in making students aware of what the program is as they are waiting for the ad hoc committee of faculty and staff to be set up. She also talked about Health Center staff wearing the buttons and having a similar flyer for students that can be handed them about what this is all about. The next cigarette pickup is scheduled for February 29 at 1:30 p.m. in front of Lillis. There will also be tabling, hopefully in the EMU. T-shirts have been ordered for group members to wear and potentially raffling off. The group is trying to meet with the group at OSU before the big conference in April to get dialogue going. They also want to do a campus forum in an open lecture hall but that is still in the works.
- c) **Student Wellness Committee** – Chantelle stated that the website is a term-long project. She asked if SHAC is interested in tabling at the Recreation Center on February 22, from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the National Sports and Fitness Day. This would be good advertising for SHAC and the Clean Air project.

6. Upcoming Business:

- a) **Budget** – Daralyn DeHaven-Murdoch will be here next week to present the preliminary information on the budget, what made up and information to be shared in the future and a future meeting with proposals. At this time of year organizations start to figure out what the next year is going to look like and want to take as much information as possible into consideration. Easier to project year-end this year and what needs will be next year.

- a) **The Oregon College Health Association (OCHA) meeting is scheduled for Friday, April 18, all day at Southern Oregon University. Andrew Epstein will be coming from a national conference on youth, perhaps he will be scheduled to present at**

this meeting. PSU is looking at creating a student group. SOU does not have a SHAC or SHAB but is interested in having students at this meeting.

- b) The International Coffee Hour tonight is a valentine coffee hour in Earl Hall from 4-6:00 p.m.
- c) China Night is scheduled for February 10 in the EMU Ballroom and tickets are available through the ticket office.
- d) World Poetry Night is scheduled for February 13.
- e) The first Indonesian Night is scheduled for February 23; time and place to be announced.
- f) There is a Students for Global Health benefit night coming up featuring the African Hokoyoko musical group. Julie Charron will send an email to Kim to send out. Proceeds will be used to provide malaria nets for people in Africa.
- g) Another new group, the Nutrition Club; www.onutrition.org. O Nutrition's mission is to provide a space for people all over the world to exchange experiences, knowledge, and tips on making life easier.
- h) Ramah Leith stated that her practicum students will be giving presentations to different clubs and groups about the Health Center services and SHAC will be highlighted.
